This module aims to provide you with an advanced understanding of the theory and practice of project implementation and management skills.

Outline Syllabus

Introduction to Project Planning and Management; Project Organisations and Structure; Role of the Project Manager; Contracting, Procurement; Project Monitoring and Control; Leadership and Management Styles; Team-building; Project Closure, Sustainability and Evaluation.

Module Learning Outcomes

On successful completion of this module, students will be able to...

- 1 Demonstrate an advanced level of understanding and evaluate key concepts and theories of project implementation and management in a development context;
- 2 Demonstrate an advanced understanding of the role of the project manager and the arguments for different project organisation configurations;
- 3 Evaluate critically options for project control and strategies for sustaining project benefits;
- 4 Demonstrate an advanced understanding of project monitoring and control, contracting, procurement and outsourcing and project sustainability;
- 5 Demonstrate an advanced understanding of the role of project managers, effective communication, teambuilding, different leadership styles, and change management;
- 6 Apply inter-personal and communication skills in a variety of project planning and management settings;
- 7 Write a critical and analytical assignment on an academic topic.

Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy

This module uses a combination of lectures, seminars and directed reading. Lectures and presentations will develop key concepts and analytical techniques (LO 1, and also contribute to LOs 2,3,4,5,6, 7), while individual critical and analytical assignments is used to develop learning and reinforce and apply some of these tools to relevant examples and cases (LOs 2,3,4, 5, 6 and 7). Emphasis is placed on the use of case studies and reflections by you on your own working experience in team work context (LO 6).

Formative assessment will be undertaken through feedback on unassessed workshop exercises, and also on draft outlines of the group and individual assignments where requested.

Summative assessment will be through an individual coursework assignment which allows you to revise, apply and demonstrate specific project planning and management knowledge and competences (LO 1,2,3,4, and 7) and a group work assignment that develops and advanced understanding of LOs 1 and also communication and teamworking skills LOs 5 and 6. Together these two assessments assess the achievement of all Learning Outcomes.
