You will demonstrate safe and competent nursing practice,

knowledge, skills and professional behaviours required at the point of first stage progression.

will help you build-on, consolidate and utilise knowledge gained from the Concepts of Health and Wellbeing module within your field of practice and across professional boundaries (LO 2.1, 2.2, 2.3, 2.4, 3.1). Small group, peer reviewed, simulated clinical skills will enable you to practice skills in a safe and supported learning environment NMC Essential Skills Clusters and Standards for Competence will assess your learning and will inform your reflections within your professional portfolio (LO 3.2, 3.3). The module will be delivered in collaboration with service users and practitioners reflecting contemporaneous healthcare practice. The VLE will be used to provide access to online resources, lecture notes & external links to websites of interest.
