Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy

Placement learning will be supervised & facilitated by PPEs. Research informed teaching and learning will ensure students engage in placement preparation & debrief. Mandatory Pre-Practice Placement Training will be included. De-brief will facilitate students to identify & record professional development within an e-portfolio, identifying future learning objectives. Reflections will be completed before, at midway and on completion of the placement to

identify learning. Resources to support learning will be available on BlackBoard.

All students will have contact with the University at the mid-point of the placement by either a visit or telephone call as a minimum.

Formative and summative assessment will use the Competency Based Fieldwork Evaluation for Occupational Therapists (CBFE) completed by the PPE and clinical colleagues. The summative element is worth 100% of the mark allocation and is calculated using the CBFE rating scale conversion which will assess all learning outcomes. An additional formative assessment will require the student to undertake a small audit or service evaluation; this may involve service users, however as part of placement learning students will engage with service users, providing opportunity for clinical engagement, and development of their learning.

Placement hours are normally calculated on a 37.5 hour week for the seven week duration of the placement, thus equalling 262.5 hours.
