You might choose to undertake a traditional dissertation in which you choose your question, research it and present it in dissertation format. Alternatively you may choose to research a particular topic and present your work in alternative formats such as draft legislation, teaching materials, a handbook, a brochure or similar. There are no formal teaching sessions for this module. Instead you will be allocated a supervisor and will work independently under their guidance. You will be required to meet with your supervisor at least 4 times during the semester to discuss your progress and receive feedback on your work. Your supervisor will guide you to clarify your research question, find and select relevant material and build an argument and produce your final output.
