There is no defined syllabus. The year abroad is voluntary and your diet of study will be chosen to be relevant to your degree studies and agreed with the Programme Leader before departure.

Study abroad years are voluntary and the diet of modules chosen will be relevant to your University of Bradford degree and agreed with the Programme Leader. Your study abroad experience is to be taken in addition to the 360 credits you study towards your degree. The range and variety of teaching and learning methods will depend on your diet of study at the partner institution. In addition to your study and assessment at the partner institution, you will keep a reflective log or journal of your learning and cultural experiences. Upon return to the University of Bradford you will submit this for assessment. During your year abroad a tutor from the University of Bradford will remain in contact with you and can provide feedback on your journal. Assessment will be on a pass/fail basis.
