Module Aims
To develop the students' knowledge and understanding of the functional organisation of the human body, and introduce the student to a range of transferable study skills in order to enhance their professional, personal and academic development.

Outline Syllabus
Identification of own level of skill for academic and personal development, including numeracy, information technology skills and presentation skills. Examine issues in a systematic manner. Cell Structure. The basic anatomy and organisation of the body into systems. Integration of systems in the maintenance of homeostasis. Anatomy and physiology of the gastrointestinal

system, cardiovascular system, respiratory system, genito-urinary system, musculoskeletal system, nervous system, endocrine system. Introduction to common conditions and their management, including physical, mental health and learning disabilities. Application of simple clinical and epidemiological data

2	Explain the mechanisms of specific diseases/conditions relevant to your area of practice
3	Organise, analyse and interpret commonly used clinical and epidemiological data
4	Demonstrate use of a variety of communication skills to report clinical information
5	Demonstrate the use of Information Technology skills to present information

Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy
