Module Aims
The module will prepare the trainee Nursing Associate to provide safe, compassionate and effective care in a range of settings.

Outline Syllabus
Apprenticeship requirements; Use of devices and clinical skills to monitor vital signs, weight, height, BMI; nutritional assessment tools; first aid; assist with feeding and drinking, fluid balance; hydration; personal protection equipment; hand hygiene; bladder and bowel care; support and intervention with toileting; privacy and dignity; collect and observe specimens of urine and stool; mobility; decontaminate equipment and environment; waste, laundry and

sharp; monitoring and supporting sleep and comfort levels; bed making with patient in situ; documenting and reporting care; reporting changes; safe oral medicines administration; reflection; academic writing; using evidence; literature searching; referencing.

Learning Outcomes

1	Demonstrate skills in a range of nursing interventions to meet people's needs for safe, dignified, effective care and symptom management.
2	Discuss the communication skills and strategies required for providing and monitoring care for a diverse range of people.
3	Demonstrate skills in safe medicine's administration.
4	Demonstrate skills in reflection, literacy and accurate data management for safe care delivery, record keeping and portfolio development.

Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy

Students will develop understanding and application of their knowledge through the use of lectures and seminars which will be evidence based and research informed. These will facilitate the achievement of LO 1,2,3. Practical sessions will facilitate application of knowledge and skills development LO 4.

Learning will be supervised in Hub and Spoke practice placements to develop knowledge and skills and gain competence in clinical skills. Supervised learning in practice will also facilitate application of theory to practice and reflection on practice. Web-based resources including the VLE will support achievement in all learning outcomes and application to practice.

Formative feedback will be available through tutorials.

The reflective coursework will assess LO 1,2,3.

The Practice Assessment Record (PAR) will assess LO 4.
