Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy

Teaching and learning strategies will develop student's abilities to demonstrate the professional skills and standards necessary to gain employment. Research informed lectures and enquiry based learning activities will engage students in exploration of professional standards and lifelong learning to enable understanding of the value of these in gaining employment. Tutorials and practical activities will include CV and application form writing, interview preparation and development of personal resilience strategies in the context of current health care provision. Students will support all learning activities with evidence from a portfolio of evidence on going

from the beginning of the programme. Assessment one will require students to select relevant evidence from this portfolio to demonstrate how they meet the Health and Care Professions Council Standards of Proficiency; this will assess LO's 1.1, 2.1, 3.1, 3.2. Assessment two requires students to engage in an interview situation; this will assess LO's 1.2, 2.2, 2.3, 3.3. Both elements must be passed.
