Outline Syllabus
Understanding the relationship between Social Work research, policy and practice; Developing literature searching and reviewing skills; Designing a research project and developing research questions; An introduction to qualitative, quantitative and mixed methods designs with research illustrations; Data collection methods and data analysis techniques; Research ethics; Informed consent and engagement of participants; Research with vulnerable populations; Considering

issues of diversity; Guidance for developing research project assignments.

3	a) demonstrate your knowledge of research methods for Social Work; b) design a research project proposal relevant to Social Work practice.
