Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy

Throughout the semester you will hone your critical thinking and reasoning skills (LO1 and LO2) which will then be assessed by coursework at the end of the module. The coursework will test your ability to explain issues and debates in Human Rights and comment on them (LO1) and present a clear and coherent argument which is based on a variety of sources (LO2, 3 and 4).
