Module Aims
This module aims to equip students with a sound grounding in core aspects of the law of succession. Students will study the legal mechanisms for inheritance and understand the difference between the law of wills, where there is a valid will, and the law of intestacy where someone dies without a valid will. The module will consider the application of the law of succession in a practical context.

Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy
This module will be delivered through 1 hour lecture and 2 hour tutorials weekly using a blended approach of on-line and face to face synchronous workshops incorporating learning objects interaction including quizzes and group activities & discussion; problem solving questions and drafting exercises. Lectures will deliver core content, providing students with the opportunity to acquire the information to enhance their knowledge and understanding of key issues. This groundwork will be complemented by workshops, each of which will be based on a key aspect of the syllabus and will provide a forum for analysis of these issues, requiring preparatory research and practical applications in aspects of will drafting and estate administration. Active participation by all students is required in all tutorials and, where appropriate lectures, in order to engage with the module. During tutorials, verbal feedback will be provided to students regarding their work and there will be an opportunity to submit formative written work for feedback prior to the summative coursework that tests all five learning outcomes. This will take the form of a problem scenario, with practical elements, that you will be required to analyse.
