Module Aims
The module will prepare the trainee Nursing Associate to work with interdisciplinary teams to provide effective complex care.

Outline Syllabus

Collect and interpret blood glucose specimens; sputum specimens; nasogastric tubes; nasal and oral suction; artificial nutrition and hydration; supporting breathing; oxygen therapy; peak flow oximetry; catheters; venepuncture; caring for the unconscious patient; neurological observations; reporting and referral within the interdisciplinary team; SBAR; end of life care, care of the deceased; communication techniques, distraction, diversion, behaviour support; using risk assessment tools; supporting continence; managing pain; safe administration of medicines by enteral, inhalation routes, suppositories and enemas; recognising and responding to side effects of medication; supporting medicines adherence and concordance with treatment; level 5 writing; critical reading.

Learning Outcomes

Outcome Number	Description
01	Critically discuss the Nursing Associates' responsibility in undertaking risk assessments, prioritising, delivering and evaluating care in line with complex treatment and care plans.
02	Demonstrate the knowledge and skills required to deliver care, including medicines management, to a person with complex care needs.
03	Contribute to the care of a person who is undergoing discharge or a transition of care between professionals, settings or services.
04	Critically reflect on own interdisciplinary communication skills.

Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy

This module will use a blended approach to learning involving face to face lectures and workshops alongside a series of online learning objects. Students will develop understanding and application of their knowledge through the use of lectures, seminars and practical sessions which will be evidence based and research informed. Online learning objects will offer a blend of synchronous lectures plus asynchronous objects including the use of LT. These will facilitate the achievement of LO 1,2, 3. Tutorials will facilitate LO4.

Learning will be supervised in Hub and Spoke practice placements. Supervised learning in practice will facilitate application of theory to practice and reflection on practice. Practical skills will be consolidated in the practice setting with an option to practice some skills face to face if there is no opportunity to experience a particular skill in practice.

Web-based resources, including the VLE will support achievement in all learning outcomes and application to practice. Formative feedback will be available through tutorials.

The reflective coursework will assess LO 1, 2 & 3. Practice attainment document (PAD) will assess LO 2, 3 and 4.
