Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy

This module uses a blended learning approach to support learning and achievement. Students will engage in a range of synchronous and asynchronous learning activities in order to address aspects of the syllabus content and module learning outcomes. The module will be delivered through research informed teaching, and will include key lectures, tutorials, enquiry based learning activities, online teaching and directed study. .Face to face, online teaching and self-directed study tasks will encourage knowledge and skills in relation to the profession of occupational therapy. The teaching will also develop student's professional, academic and personal skills. Teaching material will support learning around team working, specifically addressing communication in relation to human factors and demonstrating the ability to market and publicise the profession. Occupational analysis and therapeutic use of self are key aspects of the module. Formative assessment will occur during the module and will be linked to activities students undertake in the timetable.. Support and feedback on formative work will be provided.. There are 3 modes of summative assessment. Mode 1 is an individual reflective piece (LO 1.2 & 3.2). Mode 2 is an individual practical assessment (L.O. 1.1, 2.3. & 3.1) Mode 3 will be an individual written piece (LO 2.1& 2.2).
