Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy

Formal taught sessions will be supported by group presentations, on-line resources, videos, a computer simulation and specific support from the sponsoring organisation as appropriate. The lectures will provide the fundamentals of project management. Tutorials will be problem based and work towards the assessment. Feedback on your ideas and work will be provided formatively in tutorials. The learning strategy models the process of the learning cycle.

You will undertake a group project to deliver a project initiation document (PID) for a project of your choosing, along with an evaluation of a project that has already been undertaken at your organisation (LO1 and LO2). This will be followed by an individual reflective account of what you learned through undertaking the group project (LO3) and how it contributed towards your professional development. Both assessments will refer to the APM Body of Knowledge (7th Edition).
