Outline Syllabus
Concepts of peace, conflict and development and how they interrelate; the idea of the 'securitization of development'; economic agendas in civil wars; the failed state debate; gender dimensions of armed conflict in the South; post-war reconstruction and development. . Not every topic will be covered every year.

You will undertake independent research into case study countries from academic sources, policy documents and grey literature (LO's 1b, 2a). You will present findings in group/class discussion, and receive formative feedback from these (LO's 1c, 2a, 2b). All LO's will be tested in the assessment.
