Module Aims
This module will support development of the NMC standards for pre- registration Midwifery education (NMC 2009). It will develop skills and attitudes that will enable the student to demonstrate professional conduct and to achieve clinical competency in the care, monitoring and support of women and their families during pregnancy and puerperium (NMC 2009, NMC 2015).

Outline Syllabus
Communication skills; antenatal assessment; postnatal assessment; care planning and implementation in antenatal and postnatal periods; breastfeeding and artificial feeding; smoking cessation; nutrition, exercise and family health; antenatal screening; neonatal screening; drug administration; record keeping; user involvement in assessment; seven steps to patient safety; protection of the vulnerable including children; raising and escalating concerns; moving and handling; effective midwifery practice in antenatal and postnatal care (NMC 2009); NMC essential midwifery skills clusters required at the first progression point (NMC 2009); EC requirements in clinical portfolio (Directive 2005/36/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council 2005).

Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy
Use of a blended learning approach for all delivery of teaching i.e. a mix of on-line and on-campus delivery, a mix of synchronous and asynchronous delivery will be offered, Practical sessions will be delivered face to face and on campus whilst maintaining Health and Safety related to current guidelines Other: This module will be delivered predominately through community or ward-based midwifery practice. Students will work with an allocated clinical mentor with link lecturer support in hospital or community settings to develop the knowledge and skills required to achieve learning outcomes 2.1, 2.2, 2.3, 2.4, 2.5, 2.6, 3.1, 3.2 and 3.3. Throughout the placement students will record and reflect on learning experiences in a web-based ongoing record of achievement (ORA). The ORA must be submitted to the module workspace at the beginning of the placement and must be kept up to date throughout the module. (LO 1, 2, and 3). Tutorial: The Link Lecturer will provide formative feedback on the ORA at the intermediate point (LO 3.1, 3.4) Clinical Assessment: The final summative assessment is the culmination of a continuing assessment process. The student is graded on their achievement of module outcomes and essential skills, using a bespoke marking tool. Learning outcomes 1.1, 1.2, 1.3 2.1, 2.2, 2.3, 2.4, 2.5, 2.6, 3.1, 3.2, 3.3, will be assessed in practice (using marking tool criteria: team-working and communication, clinical skills and knowledge and professional and ethical practice, self-development and reflection). Learning outcomes 1.1, 1.2, 1.3, 3.1, 3.4 will be assessed in the ORA (using SOHS portfolio level 4 marking tool)
