Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy
A blended learning approach will be employed in the delivery of the module hours using a combination of online resources and educational technologies. LO 1.1-1.3, 3.3-3.5. Whilst completing an individual assignment collaborative learning will be sustained through support from academic tutors to develop specific skills in developing their methodology and data synthesis based on the evidence. Students will negotiate their study and techniques to be used with their academic tutor. Students will share their progress by a short summative presentation, which will feed into the formative feedback process for their final submission; LO 1.1, 1.2, 2.1- 2.3, 3.4, 3.5. Self directed study: students will immerse themselves in the current body of evidence developing an understanding of the research methods in preparation for tutorial discussions and preparation of assessment materials, LO 3.1- 3.5. Feedback from the first summative assessment will facilitate aspects of formative feedback for assessment 2. LO 1.4,2.1,3.4 are assessed by Mode of Assessment 1 and LO 1.1,1.2,1.3,2.2,2.3,3.1,3.2,3.3,3.5 are assessed by Mode of Assessment 2.
