Module Aims
A key element of this module is to increase critical awareness of the key global public health challenges in the 21st century. The module will support students to examine global patterns of disease, health and wellbeing, and to explore inequalities from a global perspective. Students will examine health systems, global health policy and governance and develop a critical appreciation of contemporary global health challenges, practice, and issues of equity and equality.

Outline Syllabus
Global and Public Health: introductions and definitions; global health and inequalities; global disease challenges: infectious and non-communicable diseases; poverty, food and water; population migration and global health - including issues of war, conflict and working with refugees and asylum seekers; globalisation and health; maternal and child health; sexual and reproductive health; health and the global environment; climate change; comparative health systems; global health policy and governance; global health and sustainable development.

Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy

The module will be delivered using research informed teaching with key lectures, seminars, directed study, and tutorials, supported with online resources and technology enhanced learning.

Key lectures will be in groups and will introduce students to relevant subject specific knowledge in relation to contemporary challenges in global health and the implications of global perspectives and policy to public health practice (LO 1, 2, 3).

Use will be made of the VLE to complement learning in the classroom and will provide access to relevant web links, podcasts and Twitter feeds (LO 1, 2, 3, 4).

Seminars, group work and individual tutorials will also support students to develop skills in critical analysis of global health literature and demonstrate critical analysis within their academic writing skills (LO 5, 6).

Students will submit a 3000 word written essay on a topic of choice, which will form the summative assessment for the module. Students will submit a 500 word draft plan of the essay for which formative feedback will be provided through tutorials.
