Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy
To meet professional requirements students must undertake placement hours. Students will undertake preparation for these placement activities in semester 1. In Semester 2 students will revise appropriate material via self-study regarding theoretical and professional issues before and during their practice placement experience. Group and individual reflection following each placement is encouraged and facilitated using debriefs, e-portfolio and reflective tools. Practice placement learning will bring together all the learning to demonstrate that all elements of the learning outcomes have been achieved and assessed through Modes of assessment 2, 3 and 4: Students will undertake one experiential placement which is on a pass/fail basis of 100 hours; Students will undertake 2 credit rating 180 hour placements; The first 180 hour placement must be passed before undertaking the next; Students are required to meet the standards of professional conduct, performance and ethics (HCPC) 3.7. Failure to meet these standards on any of the placements will constitute a fail, with a capped mark of 35 on the credit rated placements (Assessment Modes 2 and 3). Formative assessment and feedback will be given at a mid point in each practice placement to facilitate reflection, preparation for summative assessment and self-assessment. Group and individual reflection following each placement is encouraged and facilitated using e-portfolio reflective tools. The reflection is aimed at professional development as well as to facilitate the development of Assessment mode 1 which is a reflective report. Students will have a choice regarding assessment 1 of the module (written or presented). Assessment mode 1 will assess LOs, 2.6, 2.7, 3.3 and 3.6.
