The aim of this module is to enable you to further develop your nursing practice within contemporary health care settings. You will apply your underpinning knowledge and skills within planned and supervised practice experience with supported reflection opportunities given throughout your placement.

Induction to Practice 4 - policy and protocols relevant to practice area to include: IT and systems training (organised by placement organisation) Future Nurse: Standards of Proficiency for Registered Nurses and Standards for Education and Training (NMC 2018) and The Code (NMC 2018) including: professional code and values, being an accountable professional, promoting health and preventing ill health, providing and evaluating care, leading and managing nursing care and working in multidisciplinary teams, improving safety and quality of care and coordinating care for and with service users. Medicines management and reflection on and in Practice.

Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy
You should engage positively in all practice experience learning opportunities, take responsibility and use initiative to inform your own learning and professional development. You should know who to access for support when needed. You will be taught and supervised in accordance with your individual learning needs, proficiency and confidence. At mid-point of placement you will have opportunity to share and reflect on your placement experience and learning with your peers and an academic Link Lecturer in a safe and supported environment. Continuous assessment using the digital ePAD is an integral aspect of learning and teaching in practice and you are expected to show evidence of consistent achievement during the placement. You will work with and receive written and verbal feedback from a range of staff including practice supervisors and practice assessors. You will also be expected to seek written testimonies from service users. You are required to reflect on your developing knowledge and practice. Assessment is structured and recorded within your ePAD (electronic practice assessment record). You will meet with your practice assessor/supervisor at the start, mid point and final week of Practice 4 to discuss your individual learning needs and progress. An action plan will be agreed and must be recorded in the ePAD at these points. Your practice assessor/supervisor and academic assessor will support and guide you towards successfully achieving the criteria set out in the Future Nurse: Standards of Proficiency for Registered Nurses and Standards for Education and Training (NMC 2018). Assessment of practice will be commensurate with Level 5 grading rubric within the e-PAD. If you are unable to achieve any standards of proficiency through lack of opportunity then this must be clearly documented in your Electronic Practice Assessment Document. Completion of the Safe Medicate digital package and a score of at least 90% in the online exam.
