Outline Syllabus
Abnormal Uterine Bleeding: History, examination & making a clinical diagnosis of abnormal uterine bleeding problems. Investigations of AUB. Treatment options in primary care. When to refer for specialist advice including those requiring an urgent opinion. Overview of medical & surgical treatments for AUB. Overview of treatments for fibroids. Pelvic Pain: History, examination & making a clinical diagnosis of both acute & chronic presentations of pelvic pain. Treatment options available in primary care. When to refer for specialist advice including to the GUM clinic. Role of laparoscopy. Medical & surgical treatments for pelvic pain. Fertility: History, examination & making a clinical diagnosis of fertility problems & recurrent miscarriage. Investigations & appropriate management in primary care. When to refer for specialist advice. Overview of specialist fertility management. Knowledge of further specialist investigations and/or when to refer appropriately.
